CONTEXT: Jesus has been tried and condemned. He has been abused, spit upon, beaten and crucified. At noon, the sun ceased to shine until 3pm, when he breathed his last breath. Joseph of Arimathea has asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. He and Nicodemus have brought about 100 pounds of myrrh and aloes. They rolled a large stone against the entrance of the tomb and left. The chief priests asked Pilate to send a company of soldiers to guard the tomb. Pilate sent soldiers and they put a seal on the stone and set up a guard. The high priests, Pilate and the soldiers were aware that Jesus claimed he would rise from the dead on the third day. They were prepared and would do everything they could to prevent it.

HISTORICAL PRESENT: New Testament Greek often employs a device to add emphasis and to bring a scene to life. It is called the historical present. Although the even is in the past, the writer will switch to the present tense. For example, instead of writing "Jesus spoke to the crowd" they might write "Jesus speaks to the crowd." I remember how moved I was the first time I encountered it. Suddenly, it was as if I had been transported through time to Bible days and was watching the scene unfold before me. It was like listening to a news reporter giving us a play-by-play: "Jesus is getting out of the boat and laying hands on the sick and making them well." The New American Standard version (which I am using) marks these verbs with an asterisk. I have highlighted them (although I may have missed some) to make them more visible. Each time you see one, try reading the verb in the present tense. Since the present tense in Greek is "continuous" action, you might use the English equivalent. For example, John 20:1 could be translated: "Mary Magdalene is coming to the tomb early, while it is still dark. "

THE SHORTER ENDING OF MARK:

Some people today believe that Mark intentionally stopped before the proof of the resurrection and they concoct all kinds of explanations for it, some who believe that the original ending was short try to explain why he stopped here. Others use this to "prove" that the resurrection was an idea that they came up with later. But the longer ending of Mark is quoted by early church fathers, without comment. Those who want to discredit the Bible claim that Mark is the first gospel in order to promote their idea that the resurrection was not in the earliest accounts.

NOTE: John's account makes more sense as to timing and details. It looks like Mary and one or more of the others returned to the tomb when John and Peter ran to the tomb. John and Peter may have already left by the time the women returned. If all you read was the book of John, you would conclude that all they saw on the first visit was the empty tomb, and no angels. The narrative is confusing on this point, but it is to be expected from eye-witness accounts of such an incredible event. I tend to believe that it happened this way:
